

THE RIDGEWOOD FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

\$3,000 to be awarded by The Ridgewood Foundation

The Ridgewood Foundation scholarships are one-year, non-renewable awards, which are offered to Ridgewood students who are enrolling in a community college, university/college, or post-secondary school for the year following graduation. All scholarships are payable to the community college, university/college, or post-secondary school of the student's choice. The Ridgewood Foundation determined that two scholarships in the amount of \$3,000 would be offered.

* Note: If you are applying for this scholarship, you cannot also apply for The Foundation Achievement Scholarship. Also, no student will be awarded more than one of The Ridgewood Foundation scholarships.

<u>Eligibility</u>

- 1. Applicants must currently be students in good standing at Ridgewood High School.
- 2. Applicants must be seniors, graduating the current school year.
- 3. Applicants must be enrolling in a community college, university/college, or post-secondary for the first term following graduation from Ridgewood High School.
- 4. Only applications completed in entirety will be considered.
- 5. Applications must be emailed by 3:30pm on Friday, March 12, 2021. Email: ridgewoodfoundation1@gmail.com

<u>Awards</u>

- 1. Two \$3,000 scholarships will be awarded.
- 2. Scholarships will be payable any time after upon receipt of definite proof of enrollment in a university/college and upon successful completion of the first term of studies at that college/university following graduation from Ridgewood High School. Proof of enrollment may include a statement from the office of the registrar with the seal of the school or a statement on school letterhead signed by a school official. Proof of successful completion of the first term of studies may include a grade report from the university/college or an official transcript from the university/college.
- 3. Students have up to one year from the date of graduation to redeem the scholarship.

Instructions

- 1. Necessary steps:
 - a. Complete the scholarship application in its entirety.
 - b. Ask Ms. Freese to send an electronic version of your transcript to ridgewoodfoundation1@gmail.com
 - c. Fill out the Personal Information form.
 - d. Type out a single page containing the Additional Information.
 - e. Type a double-spaced, 100-500 word essay on the following topic: What the Ridgewood Foundation Scholarship would mean to me.
 - f. Ask a staff member to write you a letter of recommendation.
 - i. The recommendation must include a discussion of: Why should this student be the recipient of the Ridgewood Foundation Scholarship? How have they exhibited academic and leadership success?
 - ii. The staff member must send the letter to <u>ridgewoodfoundation1@gmail.com</u> before the due date.
- 2. When all the necessary steps have been taken, send one email that contains the required materials.
 - a. The subject of the email must include your name and which scholarship you are applying for.
 - b. Email the following to: <u>ridgewoodfoundation1@gmail.com</u>
 - i. Personal Information Form
 - ii. Additional Information write-up
 - iii. Essay
