Student Attendance

Your student's attendance record can be viewed in real-time via Skyward Family Access. Multiple attendance codes are used to indicate whether students are tardy (late) or absent from class. Please use the following key to understand their attendance patterns:

- T = Tardy (1-9 minutes late to class)
- C = Cut (10-79 minutes late to class)
- A = Absent (Did not attend class)

We encourage you to regularly monitor your students' attendance record. If you see any of the above codes, please have a conversation with them to understand why.

If your student is absent from school and the Attendance Office does receive a call from a listed parent/guardian on the same day of the absence, you will receive an automated call from Ridgewood High School @4:30PM asking you to call the attendance office. Please ensure your phone and email contact information is correct in Skyward to receive these important messages.

2022-23 Safety

As an added safety measure, <u>the building will close at 3:30 p.m.daily during the 2022-2023 school</u> <u>year</u>. Only students who are involved in activities or athletics will be allowed to stay in the building after 3:30 p.m. These students will be supervised by their coaches or activity advisors.

Student Drop-Off Zones

In order to ease morning congestion, we offer two student drop-off zones. Students can be dropped off at the north end of the west staff parking lot next to the main entrance off of Montrose Ave. OR outside of Door #12 next to the cafeteria in the east student parking lot. Please keep in mind that Door #12 is locked at 8AM, and any students dropped off after that time must access the building through Door #2, the main entrance.

Lost and Found

At the end of each school year, our Building and Grounds team empties all student lockers. If your returning sophomore, junior, or senior believes that they left items in their locker, those items can be retrieved from the Dean's Office. All items remaining after Friday 9/2/22 will be donated or disposed of.

If your student loses property throughout the school year, the lost and found is located at the Front Desk.

Student Lockers

All students are assigned a school locker and their locker number can be found on their Skyward profile. All locks must be RHS school-issued green locks. To obtain a lock, students should see Assistant Principal Lasky in the Principal's Wing. Freshmen and new transfer students paid for their lock through registration, while returning sophomores through seniors requiring a new lock should report to the Business Office to obtain a lock.

2022-23 Academic Schedule

Using family, staff, and student feedback, we have adjusted last year's schedule to meet the needs of all learners. The 2022-23 schedule will maintain the same alternating A/B daily routine throughout the school year eliminating the need to run alternative schedules due to federal holidays, teacher institute days, etc.

Benefits of the 2022-23 schedule include:

- Daily consistency for students
- An A/B rotation to balance students' course load
- Opportunities for students to earn more than 6 credits per school year
- Increased instructional minutes per course (80 minutes) to allow for deeper learning and a variety of activities/ instruction during a single class period
- Flexibility for students to participate in internships or work-based learning outside of RHS
- A daily shortened Flex period for students to pursue things like resource labs, self-directed projects, career exploration, robust science labs, small group sessions with teachers, hands-on activities, and more

Health Protocols

Our main priority at Ridgewood High School continues to be everyone's health and safety. Per collective guidance from the IDPH and the CDC:

- Monitor your student(s) for any symptoms of illness, and please do not send them to school if they are sick (contact Candace Reid, School Nurse at 708-697-5568.
- RHS will continue to be mask-optional.
- Students who test positive for COVID-19 will quarantine for a minimum of 5 days <u>AND</u> will be able to learn remotely.
- Optional, weekly, and free COVID-19 testing will again be made available for students and staff members - <u>REGISTER HERE.</u>
- Safety measures regarding ventilation, handwashing, and respiratory etiquette will still be in place.
