


Dear Ridgewood Families,

PSAT NMSQT Testing

On Wednesday, October 12th, Ridgewood High School will administer the Preliminary SAT (PSAT)/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (NMSQT) to all juniors and the top 10% of sophomores. By offering students an opportunity to participate in the PSAT administration, Ridgewood High School will provide students with valuable college readiness feedback and tools to help them reach their post-secondary goals.

Benefits of the PSAT:

- Juniors can qualify for the National Merit Scholarship By taking the PSAT/NMSQT students may be eligible to qualify for the National Merit Scholarship Program and other academic scholarship and recognition programs.
- Students have a better chance at scoring higher on the SAT Historically, students who take the
 PSAT have scored significantly higher on the SAT than students who do not. Since the PSAT
 evaluates the same skills and knowledge as the SAT, taking the PSAT means students will have
 an opportunity to address their areas of improvement long before they take their official college
 entrance exam.
- Students will receive feedback on their aptitude for success in AP courses student score reports will show recommendations for AP courses that might be good matches.
- A personalized study plan the PSAT will provide students with a custom SAT study plan that can be accessed online, anytime through Khan Academy.

Important Test Day Information:

- Testing will begin promptly at 8:45am. Students should arrive in the field house at least 15 minutes prior to testing.
- No backpacks or cell phones will be allowed in the field house.
- Students will need to bring their Student ID, no. 2 pencils, and a calculator.
- Standard testing time will conclude around 12:50 pm.
- Students will have lunch from 12:55pm 1:24pm.
- Students will be required to attend period 10 from 1:40pm 3:00pm.

Deadlines and Retake Opportunities

In an effort to ensure students are college and career ready, it is imperative that all students understand the importance of deadlines. All due dates will be communicated, and students will be given an ample and appropriate amount of time to complete assignments. Students are expected to complete all assignments by the assigned due date.

Competency Courses - Grading Reminders

As a reminder, many of our courses use competency grading to show a student's level of proficiency in skills. This means that these courses show an average level of proficiency, shown by a numeric value, rather than a traditional letter grade, to show student's progress in learning. Teachers will enter letter grades at the end of each semester for a student's transcript. During the semester, please click on the student's FG score in order to see your student's overall percentage in the course out of 100. Freshman and Senior School Medical Information

The State of Illinois requires all freshmen students to have a physical exam on file in the Nurse's office. Similarly, all seniors are required to submit proof of one meningitis vaccination after the age of 16. <u>These</u> <u>documents are due by October 15th.</u>

Student and Building Safety

Every year, all students are trained how to respond to an active shooter scenario using the Run, Hide, Fight model during Advisory on B days. Training is currently underway provided by the Dean of Students and will conclude mid-October, culminating with a scheduled, announced Law Enforcement Drill. No actors, fake weapons, or simunitions of any kind will be used during the drill. More information will be shared as we near the drill date.

Part of students' Run, Hide, Fight training includes our **See Something, Say Something** campaign. We need our students' help in keeping our school community safe, and they play a vital role. All students are encouraged to immediately report any suspicious or concerning behavior to a trusted adult, or through our anonymous <u>Safety Concern / Bullying Report</u>. Reporters always remain anonymous and will not face any type of disciplinary action.

Student Attendance

This year, we are playing music for students during our 5-minute passing periods between classes. 30 seconds before the next period is scheduled to begin, music stops and a countdown begins on all hallway

clocks. Our expectation for students is that when clocks reach zero, they are in their seats and ready to learn.

Your student's attendance record can be viewed in real-time via Skyward Family Access. Multiple attendance codes are used to indicate whether students are tardy (late) or absent from class. Please use the following key to understand their attendance patterns:

- T = Tardy (1-9 minutes late to class)
- C = Cut (10-79 minutes late to class)
- A = Absent (Did not attend class)

We encourage you to regularly monitor your students' attendance record. If you see any of the above codes, please have a conversation with them to understand why.

If your student is absent from school and the Attendance Office does receive a call from a listed parent/guardian on the same day of the absence, you will receive an automated call from Ridgewood High School @4:30PM asking you to call the attendance office. Please ensure your phone and email contact information is correct in Skyward to receive these important messages.

Student Lockers

If your student is planning on using their school locker but has not picked up their lock yet, please have them do so as soon as possible. Freshmen and new transfer students can pick up a lock from Assistant Principal Lasky's office, and returning sophomores, juniors, and seniors can receive a lock from the Dean's Office.

Starting today, our Building and Grounds crew will begin bolting shut all unused lockers as an added measure to ensure safety.

Reminder! Building closes at 3:30

As an added safety measure, <u>the building will close at 3:30 p.m.daily during the 2022-2023 school</u> <u>year</u>. Only students who are involved in activities or athletics will be allowed to stay in the building after 3:30 p.m. These students will be supervised by their coaches or activity advisors.

Student Drop-Off Zones

In order to ease morning congestion, we offer two student drop-off zones. Students can be dropped off at the north end of the west staff parking lot next to the main entrance off of Montrose Ave. OR outside of Door #12 next to the cafeteria in the east student parking lot. Please keep in mind that Door #12 is locked at 8AM, and any students dropped off after that time must access the building through Door #2, the main entrance.
