## Freshman and Senior School Medical Information

The State of Illinois requires all freshmen students to have a physical exam on file in the Nurse's office. Similarly, all seniors are required to submit proof of one meningitis vaccination after the age of 16. These documents are due by October 15th.

If your student does not submit their forms by October 15th at 8 a.m., they will be excluded from school.

#### Competency Courses - Grading Reminders

As a reminder, many of our courses use competency grading to show a student's level of proficiency in skills. This means that these courses show an average level of proficiency, shown by a numeric value, rather than a traditional letter grade, to show student's progress in learning. Teachers will enter letter grades at the end of each semester for a student's transcript. During the semester, please click on the student's FG score in order to see your student's overall percentage in the course out of 100. #### **PSAT NMSQT Testing**

On Wednesday, October 12th, Ridgewood High School will administer the Preliminary SAT (PSAT)/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (NMSQT) to all juniors and the top 10% of sophomores. By offering students an opportunity to participate in the PSAT administration, Ridgewood High School will provide students with valuable college readiness feedback and tools to help them reach their post-secondary goals.

## Benefits of the PSAT:

- Juniors can qualify for the National Merit Scholarship By taking the PSAT/NMSQT students may be eligible to qualify for the National Merit Scholarship Program and other academic scholarship and recognition programs.
- Students have a better chance at scoring higher on the SAT Historically, students who take the PSAT have
  scored significantly higher on the SAT than students who do not. Since the PSAT evaluates the same skills and
  knowledge as the SAT, taking the PSAT means students will have an opportunity to address their areas of
  improvement long before they take their official college entrance exam.
- Students will receive feedback on their aptitude for success in AP courses student score reports will show recommendations for AP courses that might be good matches.
- A personalized study plan the PSAT will provide students with a custom SAT study plan that can be accessed

online, anytime through Khan Academy.

Important Test Day Information:

- Testing will begin promptly at 8:45am. Students should arrive in the field house at least 15 minutes prior to testing.
- No <u>backpacks</u> or <u>cell phones</u> will be allowed in the field house.
- Students will need to bring their Student ID, no. 2 pencils, and a calculator.
- Standard testing time will conclude around 12:50 pm.
- Students will have lunch from 12:55pm 1:24pm.
- Students will be required to attend period 10 from 1:40pm 3:00pm.

#### Parent Teacher Conferences

It is almost time for our 2022 Fall Conferences! Due to the positive feedback and participation levels of families, we will offer conferences remotely via ZOOM for fall conferences. Families should log into Skyward Family Access, click on their student's schedule, and choose the teachers, counselors, and social workers they would like to meet with. Step-by-step instructions are included below. Here is the date and time of conferences:

Registration will open starting October 1st and will close at 8:00 A.M. on October 25th. Once registration closes, you must contact the teacher/ staff member directly to schedule an appointment. Our staff will email the conference Zoom link directly to families scheduled for conferences on October 26th.

Current student grades will be accessible via our online student information system, Skyward. Please log into Skyward in advance of your conference to review and/or print your student's grades.

Students are welcome and encouraged to participate in the conferences with their parents/guardians and to be an active part of the discussion about their academic progress. If, for any reason, you cannot make an appointment during these times, please reach out directly to our staff. Our teachers, counselors, and social workers would be happy to meet with you at a time that works for you. We look forward to talking with you and your student(s) at conferences.

# Scheduling Teacher Conferences in Skyward Family Access To access this area, click on the Conferences Tab on the left hand side. Next, select the "All Conferences" hyperlink. This area allows you to schedule times for your conference as well as view scheduled times with your student's teachers. ? **Scheduling Times** The top area is for Teacher Conferences. Your student's schedule will appear. To schedule a time, under the Status column, click on the Select a Time hyperlink to schedule a time for the class/teacher that appears to the right. Another screen will appear with all available time spots, click on the Select hyperlink for the desired time. A confirmation screen will appear, click on Save. Repeat for all desired classes/teachers.

The bottom area is for Staff Conferences, this would be either a counselor, social worker, etc. To schedule a time with a desired staff, other than a teacher, follow the same directions for scheduling a time with teachers.

#### Post-Secondary Planning

Senior year can be quite stressful for students as they navigate their senior year while planning life after high school. For many students, there is a belief that they should attend community college to keep costs down. Still, for many of our students, if they apply for Early Action, they can earn merit-based scholarships that would significantly impact the cost. I have seen many seniors get full-ride scholarships! To help students narrow down their lists and meet the Early Action deadlines in November, we have planned several support opportunities:

- Students met with the counseling team to:
  - Review senior timeline
  - Create a Common Application account and link it to School Links
  - Download and access their transcripts
- We will have ongoing visits from colleges and universities. Students can sign up during flextime and meet with admission counselors to learn about their programs and specific scholarships.
- Every Thursday through December 1st, students can meet with a counselor during Flextime to assist with their applications.




#### Freshman, Sophomore, and Junior Yearbook Picture Retakes:
