Parent Teacher Conferences

It is time for 2023 Spring Conferences! Due to the positive feedback we heard from families and the increased number in attendance since offering virtual conferences, we will continue to **offer conferences remotely via ZOOM again this year**. RHS families will have the opportunity to meet with students' teachers, counselors, and social workers. Families will log into Skyward Family Access, click on their student's schedule, and choose the teachers, counselors, and social workers they would like to meet with. Step-by-step instructions are at the end of this letter. Here is the date and time of conferences:

Registration will open February 21st and will close at 8:00 A.M. on March 15th. Once registration closes, you must contact the teacher directly to schedule an appointment. Our staff will email the conference Zoom link directly to families scheduled for conferences on March 15th.

Current student grades will be accessible via our online student information system, Skyward. Please log into Skyward in advance of your conference to review and/or print your student's grades.

Students are welcome and encouraged to participate in the conferences with their parents/guardians and to be an active part of the discussion about their academic progress. If, for any reason, you cannot make an appointment during these times, *please reach out directly to our staff*. Our teachers, counselors, and social workers would be happy to meet with you at a time that works for you. We look forward to talking with you and your student(s) at conferences.

Illinois Science Assessment (ISA)

On Monday, March 20th, Ridgewood High School will administer the ISBE-sponsored Illinois Science Assessment (ISA) to all Juniors. This assessment helps families understand how well students are performing academically and see whether they are on track to succeed in college. The ISA represents Illinois' commitment to preparing all students for college and careers, including in the high-demand science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) fields. The assessment also satisfies federal accountability requirements.

Important Test Day Information:

- Students will be using their RHS issued iPad for testing, so please make sure to bring your fully charged iPad
- Testing will begin promptly at 8AM and end approximately around 11:30AM in the Field House
- Students are expected to attend classes after testing is completed

Academic Summer Opportunities 2023



ATTENTION PARENTS/GUARDIANS/STUDENTS:

Ridgewood High School is pleased to announce our opportunities for the summer of 2023. These opportunities will only be offered in-person and include: summer school, driver education and 9th grade summer programs. Information about each opportunity can be found below.

Driver Education

Driver Education - CLASSROOM

The dates for Driver Education are June 12-July 26, 2023; Monday-Thursday.
No school June 19 and July 3-4, 2023. The fee for the program is \$60.

Driver Education – BEHIND THE WHEEL

The dates for Driver Education are June 12-July 26, 2023; Monday-Thursday. No school June 19 and July 3-4, 2023. The fee for the program is \$240.

Incoming 9th Grade Programs

Incoming 9th grade students who wish to partake in RHS summer school in the areas of reading and/or math may do so free of charge. These courses could be for acceleration or remediation, whichever is necessary for the individual student.

The dates for this freshman program are:

- June 20-July 20, 2023: Monday-Thursday from 8:00-11:00 A.M.

Summer School

Students that have not met course requirements and have earned Not Mets for the 2022-23 school year will be enrolled in Summer School to retake the course in order to stay on track for graduation. Summer School runs June 12-July 20 from 8:00-11:00 A.M. on Monday through Thursday. There is no Summer School on June 19, July 3, and July 4. By attending the dates and times of summer school provided by Ridgewood High School, students can make-up 1.0 credit over Summer School. If there is an extenuating circumstance where a student needs to make up more than 1.0 credit, it must be approved by Katie Davis, Division Head of Student Services and Career Pathways.

*If students would like to make-up courses outside of Ridgewood High School, RHS counselors will provide them with resources such as Triton night classes, American School, Penn Foster, or another local high school.

The following courses are recommended for the 2023 Summer School **credit recovery** offerings:

- Math
- English
- Physical Education
- Health
- PLTW
- US History
- Career Exploration (1/2 credit)
- Computer Science (1/2 credit)



*2022-23 seniors will have an exception to the courses listed above.

Fees for the 2022 Summer School Program:

- \$350 in district, \$400 out of district for 1.0 credit
- \$200 in district, \$250 out of district for 0.5 credits
