

This allows you to notify your student's school when your student will be absent.

- 1. Click Enter Absent Request.

- 4. Click the drop-down list to select a Reason why your student will be absent.
- 5. If desired, enter a Comment.
- 6. Click Save. Note that the Status is pending and awaiting approval from the attendance office.

## **Girls Soccer**

Coach Kenny Caslin and the Varsity Girls' Soccer Team just recently completed their regular season and will compete in the IHSA Regional Playoffs (May 16, 2017 at 6:30 pm vs Lakes HS, hosted at Ridgewood HS). The girls completed the regular season with a record of 8-8-1, which is an improvement on last year's record of 7-15. They finished third in conference with a record of 3-2, beating Guerin (10-0), St. Edward (4-0) and Timothy Christian (4-0) and losing to Elmwood Park (0-1) and Chicago Christian (0-2). The Rebels scored 18 conference goals and only conceded three goals. Overall, they scored 40 goals and conceded 20 in all of their matches. The team has 13 seniors this year, with plenty of talent and experience, which is one of the reasons why they performed so well during the season. Some of these seniors plan to play college soccer at Dominican, Loyola, and the University of Illinois. In addition, one of the members of the team earned an academic scholarship to Princeton University.

#### Softball

Coach Mike Glaub and the Varsity Softball team currently have a 15-11 overall record. After some early season struggles, they turned things around and are back to winning ways. The team is relatively young, consisting of five seniors, five juniors, two sophomores and two freshmen. The team recently won the Fenton "Bison Blast" Tournament, beating Waukegan, Fenton and Cary Grove (in the championship). The girls also just beat MSC Conference opponent, St. Edward High School, by a score of 10-0; and in doing so, earned the Metro-Suburban Red Division Championship. It is the third year in a row that the team has won the conference title! The team is wrapping up the regular season and look to enter the IHSA Regionals with a #10 seed, playing against Johnsburg, the #8 seed, on Wednesday, May 24 at 4:30 pm at Ridgewood High School.

#### <u>Baseball</u>

Coach Vince Fanelli and the Varsity Baseball team has a 15-12 overall record. The team is young, with only three seniors, seven juniors and four sophomores. During Spring Break, the team traveled to Phoenix, Arizona to compete in the "Coach Bob National Invitational" where they earned their first "out of state" win against Hood River High School (Oregon). The team is playing a very difficult non-conference schedule, with wins against Nazareth Academy and Benet Academy, along with a challenging conference schedule. The team is currently sitting in second place in the MSC Red, Division. The team had the unique opportunity to travel to Milwaukee, Wisconsin to play a game against Portage High School at Miller Park (home of the Milwaukee Brewers). It is the second year in a row that the team had the opportunity to make the memorable trip. The Rebels are seeded #8 in the Lakeview Sectional. They will play the #9 seed, Wauconda, on Thursday, May 25 at 4:30 pm at Ridgewood High School.

# **Athletic Update (Continued)**

## Track & Field

Coach Guagenti and the Girls Track & Field hosted the Metro Suburban Red Championship on Friday, May, 5. The Rebels placed 4th overall, narrowly missing 3rd place by 4 points. All-conference honors were achieved by Nicole Woloszyn in the triple jump, and Vicky Ignacik was Conference Champion in three events (100m hurdles, 300m hurdles, 200m dash). The team then competed at the IHSA Glenbard South Sectional on Thursday, May 11, 2017. The team scored 27 points and took 8th overall (15 teams total). Nicole Woloszyn placed 5th in the long jump and 6th in the triple jump. Vicky Ignacik place 3rd in the 200m dash, 2nd in the 300m hurdles, and won the 100m hurdles. Vicky's hurdle finishes qualified her for the State Finals in both events. She will compete again on May 19-20 at State.

On May 12, 2017, the Boys Track & Field team competed at the Metro Suburban Red Championship at Elmwood Park. The team took 2nd place overall, and had several outstanding performances. The 4x100m relay team of Alex Valentin, Cody Frerking, Alex Rice, and Pawel Janezcek placed 2nd to obtain All-Conference honors. Individual All-Conference performances were also obtained by Pawel Janezcek (2nd place in both the 110m hurdles and 300m hurdles), Paul Plichta (3rd place 400m dash), and Cody Frerking (3rd in high jump and 2nd in triple jump). Alex Rice was a Conference Champion in both the long jump and triple jump.

We will honor the student-athletes of the spring season, as well as announce the MCS All-Conference winners and the Male and Female Athletes of the Year. 
